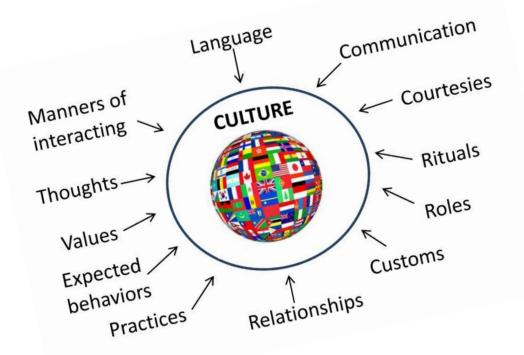

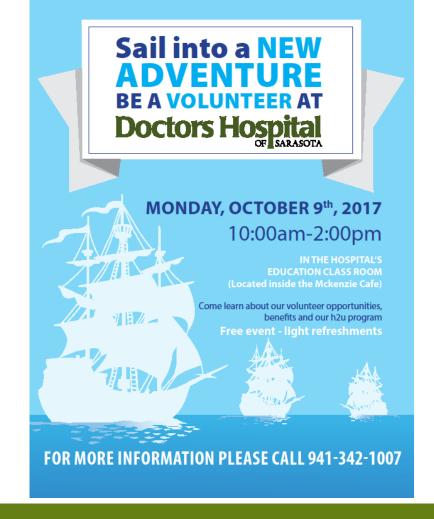

- Personally, one of my goals

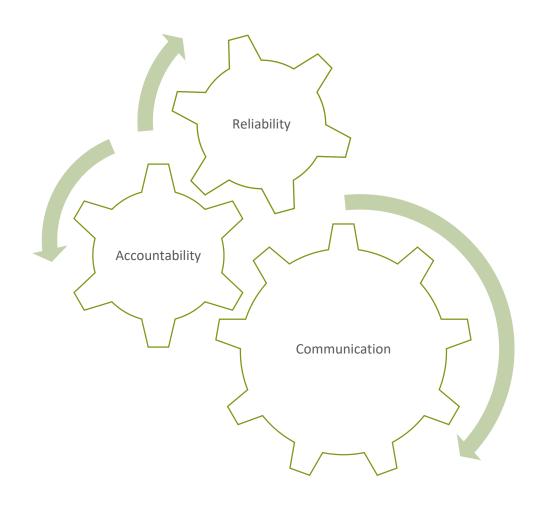
DAY-TO-DAY
